The bagpipe has been in existence in various forms since Biblical times when shepherds played reed pipes while watching over their flocks. Most all European countries have had their own version of bagpipes at one time or another, but only in Scotland has the bagpipe evolved into such a prominent instrument. Originally used to muster the clans and then to lead the Scottish army to battle, the bagpipes have also found a place filling houses of worship with their melodious strains. With only nine notes set in a Mixolydian mode, the bagpipes have a range and sound unlike any other instrument in the world.

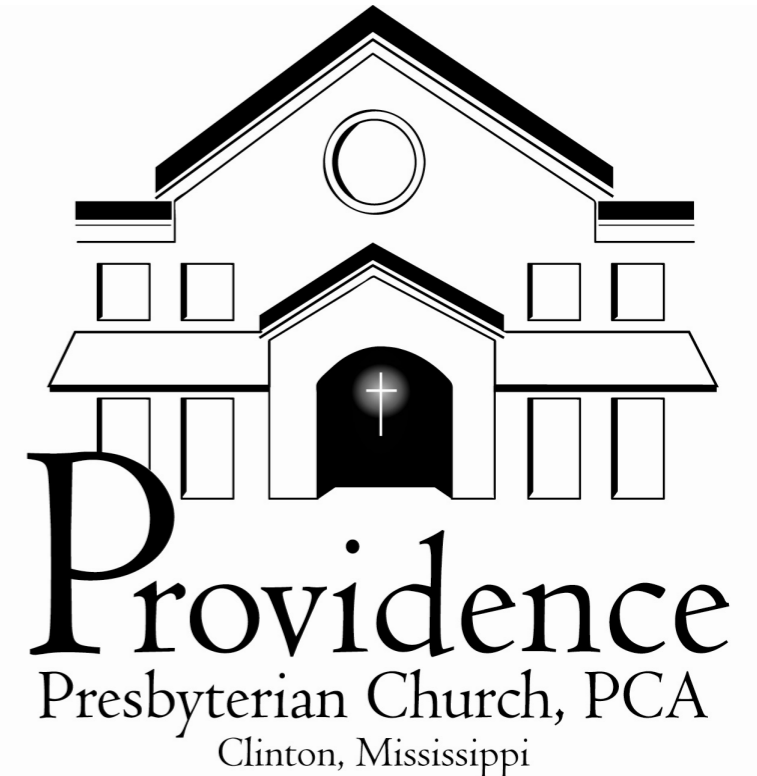
